



**Here are two ways to spark ideas:**

### #1: GET INSPIRED BY REAL FLAGS

Many countries use colors, shapes, and symbols on their flags to tell a story about their history, values, or land.

Here are some examples:



**Bhutan**

A dragon with jewels in its claws shows wealth and security.



**South Africa**

Bold stripes and many colors show different groups coming together as one.




## Kenya

*The shield in the center represents defending the country.*




## Japan

*A simple red circle represents the sun.*



## Nepal

*A unique shape (not a rectangle) shows tradition and identity.*



## Switzerland

*The only square flag instead of a rectangle, with a bold white cross.*

## #2: WHAT CAN GO ON A FLAG?

Flags are made using different design elements. You can mix and match these when creating your own flag.

Ideas to include on flags:

**Colors** - bright, dark, or meaningful

**Patterns** - stripes, zigzags, checks, spirals

**Symbols** - stars, suns, animals, plants, tools

**Emblems** - shields, crests, badges

**Shapes** - triangles, diagonals, borders


**Special details** - unique shaped flag, symmetry or one big symbol

## HOW COUNTRIES GET THEIR NAMES

**Do you know how different countries in the world are named?**  
Read on to learn how! You can use this as a guide while you name YOUR country while answering question #2:

Countries are often named in different ways to tell people:

- **what kind of place they are**
- **who lives there**
- **what they care about**

Ways countries are named:

### **"United ..."**

This means different **states, regions, or groups** have come together as one country.

*Example: United Mexican States (Mexico)*

*Use this if your country is made of many places or many kinds of people.*

# HOW COUNTRIES GET THEIR NAMES

**Do you know how different countries in the world are named?**  
Read on to learn how! You can use this as a guide while you name YOUR country while answering question #2:

Ways countries are named:

## **"Republic of ..."**

This means the people help choose their leaders, usually by **voting**.

*Example: Republic of India*

*Use this if your country believes in fairness, voting, and shared power.*

## **"Commonwealth of ..."**

This means people work together for the **common good** – what helps everyone, not just one person. The word comes from “common” (shared) and “wealth” (well-being, not just money).

*Example: Commonwealth of Australia*

**Remember:** Some countries are both a republic AND a commonwealth. Your imaginary country can mix ideas, too!

## **"Kingdom of ..."**

This means the country has a **king or queen** (real or imaginary!).

*Example: Kingdom of Morocco*

*Use this if your country has royalty, castles, or magical rulers.*

## **"Land of ..."**

This style describes what the **country is known for**.

*Example: Land of the Rising Sun (a nickname for Japan)*

*Use this if your country is all about one big idea, place, or value.*
